Providence, Provision, and Perseverance

Last summer about this time, we were coming off a parking lot graduation and drive-thru reception having completed our fourth quarter online. While it was far from ideal, we were able to get through curriculum and complete our school year without missing a day. We looked ahead to an uncertain school year start in the fall. We waited almost every other week for news to come from state leadership as to what the start of the fall school year would look like, and we did our best to make our plans accordingly. We limited the size of some of our classes, not knowing what type of protocol we would need to have in place and how that would affect enrollment. But God gave us wisdom because we asked, and we equipped all of our classrooms, fourth grade and up, with Zoom cameras and systems which would allow students who were ill or quarantine at home to watch class and not miss any days of school. While we were determined to have "in-person" school, we wanted to be ready.

Meetings with our lead staff at the church and school yielded planning for cleaning and disinfecting, above and beyond what we had ever done before. Protocols were put in place and preparations for an "in-person" school year were ready. Everyone was on board, and we all were determined to move ahead. We asked for parent volunteers to clean and the response was excellent. We created a new spending line item called, "COVID spending," and despite the increased and unbudgeted spending necessary to put our plan together, God provided all that we needed through savings and the generosity of

several of our families. We would be ready if the government would allow us to move forward, and that would include having an entire school program of academics, fine arts, and sports. We were determined to return to a semblance of normalcy. It would all just look a bit different.



We determined to obey the specific school mandates requiring masks, and that caused a lot of turmoil. While we believed it was the right decision at the time, we lost some of our students and that was unfortunate. The most difficult aspect of moving forward was the fear and uncertainty of our parents and families. Fear was rampant, and the press did nothing but promote a further culture of it. Perspectives were all over the map which ranged from folks refusing to come to school to those who thought the whole thing was a hoax.

So we turned to the Lord again, and we asked for wisdom on how to move forward, and for provision to make our payroll and meet all of our expenses. While I would admit to you

Of the 17 graduates this year, one is planning to attend community college, thirteen will attend a university program, two will receive technical school training, and one is planning to take classes online.

The graduates' plans for majors include one Pediatric Nurse, five Business majors (Marketing, Administration, Leadership, and Management), one Biomedical Engineer, one Accountant, two Psychology majors, one Electrician, one Economist, one Humanities major, one Computer Science major, one Christian Ministries major, and one who wants to receive technical school training to work in the field of Robotics.

In addition, twelve of our graduates received scholarships in preparation for the college years! This particular class will have ten of its members attend Christian college in the fall.

We are proud of our FBCS Class of 2021. Congratulations students!

that this was one of the most difficult, frustrating, and discouraging years of my educational career, I can testify that God was at work at every turn, and I learned how to trust my God again. While there were struggles, and those struggles indeed took their toll, we saw the goodness of God as we wrestled daily to move forward and operate our school. God gave us the strength to persevere and we made it. Recent achievement testing showed us that we didn't lose ground academically. Our students have done quite well. In addition, many new families are checking out our school and our enrollment numbers are up for next year.

The truth is that we are not in any different position than we were before. We find ourselves with new challenges facing the new school year. What are we to do? We do what we did before, and we ask our families to turn to the Lord in prayer again and trust in His providence and provision. Our current struggle is to find qualified teachers who would allow us to grow. We may be looking for as many as three new elementary teaching positions. The available pool of teachers

is small, and graduates from Christian colleges in the areas of education are diminishing. This is a huge point of prayer as we either limit or expand our growth based upon finding qualified teachers. So we turn to the Lord again for guidance because He has been faithful to give us wisdom in the past. Please know that we covet your prayers for our school ministry, and if you know of teachers looking to teach in a Christian school, please direct them to us.

Thank you to all of our staff, volunteers, church family and school families for all of your help, prayers, and support. In the past year, we have been stretched but we have grown. A special "thank you" goes to our students for tolerating the Covid protocols in place for the duration of the year and for persevering through it. I think we saw a more "grown up" group of secondary students as they faced this school year.






