This year, the Minnesota Association of Christian Schools hosted its annual music festival (Band concentration) on the 4<sup>th</sup> of November. Next year, we will switch to a choir concentration (2017). The tentative date for next year's festival will be **Friday, November 3** at Fourth Baptist.

Five schools participated this year: Chisago Lakes Baptist, First Baptist of Rosemount, Fourth Baptist, Lake Region, and Woodcrest. Seventy-seven students took part in this year's program directed by Dr. Jerry Luckhardt, Director of Graduate Studies, Associate Director of Bands, and Associate Professor at the University of Minnesota.

Earlier in the year, selected music pieces were given to band directors at our schools for practice and preparation for this day. The day-long exercise was an effort to put everything together for an early evening program presented by all participating students for

We held our annual Sports Walk on Sept. 19<sup>th</sup> this year, where our students in 6<sup>th</sup> grade through 12<sup>th</sup> grade walked along a 10-mile course around Medicine Lake to raise funds for our athletic programs. 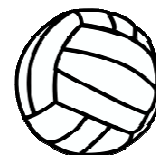

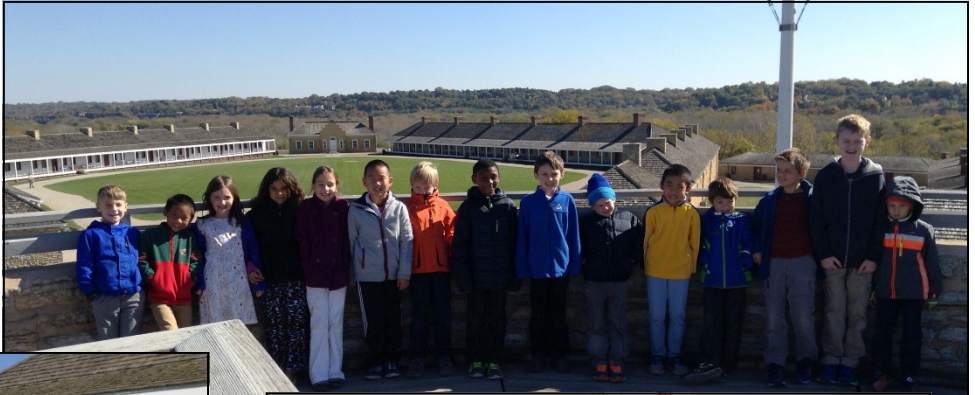

**With the Lord**  
**OPAL M. UNDERBAKKE**  
February 26, 1925 – October 18, 2016

Opal was a Secondary English & Speech teacher at Fourth Baptist Christian School from 1981—1989. As head of the Language Arts Department, she also taught remedial English. While a teacher at FBCCS, she also wrote and directed a play, entitled "Miracles of Love," which she has copyrighted. Miss

Mary Wickham said it was beautifully done and people still talk about it.

As for her legacy as a teacher, many students who had her as a teacher claim that although she was a hard teacher and expected a lot from her students, they learned so much from her that helped them so much in college and in their future careers. A former student wrote this on her Facebook wall on her birthday in 2013, "When I think of you, it is with a heart full of gratitude for all that you taught me!" Another former student wrote, "You are the hardest and best teacher I've ever had...even through college and grad school. I wish my kids could be under your teaching! ...I always think of you fondly and I'm so grateful for your impression on my life." To which Opal replied, "Thank you, Jason, for contacting me. I have a joyful, affectionate memory of each and every student at Fourth. I would appreciate hearing about your vocation and family. Thanks again for taking time to contact me."

Here is a slightly condensed version of her obituary notice:

*Opal Marie Underbakke was born on February 26, 1925 on a farm near Burr Oak, Iowa to Louie and Violet (Wilbur-Ward) Underbakke.*

*She was baptized and confirmed at the Burr Oak United Methodist Church. Opal attended grade school at Pierce-Underbakke School No. 6 and graduated from Canton High School in 1942. After high school, she attended Upper Iowa University in Fayette, IA and graduated with a Bachelor degree in English/Speech Education. She went on to pursue her Master's degree at Luther College in Decorah, IA. Opal married Harold (Bud) E. Smith in 1954, and they raised five children.*

*Opal had a passion for learning and shared her knowledge in the educational field for more than 65 years. She taught in both private and public schools and also tutored many individuals. She developed and implemented a large number of drama and speech programs and was always available to help her students. She was a motivational teacher and inspiration for many of her students who demonstrated success in the fields of education, broadcasting, business, and politics.*

*Opal had a love for reading, traveling, and gardening. In early travels, she explored the United States and later travels included Mexico, Europe, and the Bahamas. She also won awards for her horticultural design and execution. She was very community minded and frequently helped with youth and community projects. Opal had a strong religious faith and enjoyed sharing with others. She was very connected to her church communities and had a deep love for them, including ..... Chisago Lakes Baptist Church (Chisago City, MN), and Fourth Baptist Church (Minneapolis, MN). She was actively involved in church outreach and charitable programs.*


