The celebration looks back at the accomplishments of the high school years and looks forward to the promise of the college years. We believe that our graduation ceremony is unique. Senior slideshow memories were shared with pictures from early childhood to present while airing a recording of expressions of thanks from the graduates. The ceremony also featured messages from the valedictorian and salutatorian, as well as the presentation of awards and diplomas. Pastor Jeremy Stephens gave our commencement address this year.

This year our salutatorian was Nick Carlson. Nick graduated with a 3.81 G.P.A. His address was a light-hearted look at each of the members of the Class of 2019, highlighting a character trait that stood out. He did a great job delivering his speech and closed it out with an admonition to not get lost in the past, but rather "to put to use the talents and abilities given to us by God and cultivated here at Fourth."

The valedictorian was Abigail Kolacz. Abbey graduated with a 4.09 G.P.A. Abbey spoke to her

class about staying faithful in the little things. "Every vocab lesson, math assignment, poem, memory verse, and physics problem mattered." Said Abbey, "Every shift at Chick-fil-A, volleyball game, and lawn mowed mattered because all were opportunities to live for God's glory. Teacher Farewell

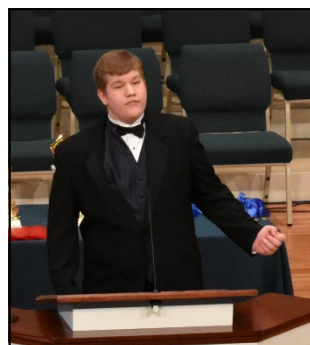

2019 SH MACS FINE ARTS FESTIVAL

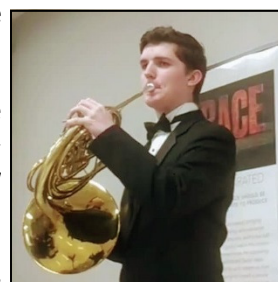


The SH MACS Fine Arts Festival was hosted by FBCS on April 5, 2019. Ten MACS schools and 300 students participated this year. 81 of our own FBCS students participated in various music, art, and academic events. We had a very full schedule of music performances that kept our students busy participating and

watching throughout the day. Our FBCS groups did very well and placed high in several categories including Band, Choir, Choral Group, Large and Small Vocal Ensembles, Handbell Choir, Large and Small Instrumental Ensembles, and many other small groups and solos.

We had so many of our own students wanting to participate in the piano categories, we held “blind auditions” in advance to choose our school’s entries. Of those who were chosen to participate in MACS, Morgan Stephens took first place in the Sacred Piano Solo and Kayla Stephens & Tyler Martin finished first in Sacred Piano Duet.

Earning first place in the Instrumental categories were the Brass Ensemble, Gold Handbell Choir, Percussion Ensemble, and Brass Solo—Aaron French on the French Horn. First place finishes in the Vocal category were Male Vocal Solo—Matthew Nyquist, Vocal Duet—Morgan Stephens & Joelle Webster, and the Choral Group—our Mixed Ensemble. Matthew Nyquist was chosen to perform vocal solo, *O Mistress Mine*, during the awards ceremony, which is a high honor.



Students learned much from the judges and their helpful comments. Several students also placed very well in art and academic testing. Elaine Feng won Best in Show for her oil painting. We are very thankful for the abilities that the Lord has given to our students and are pleased with the results of the day. —Mr. Kolwinska

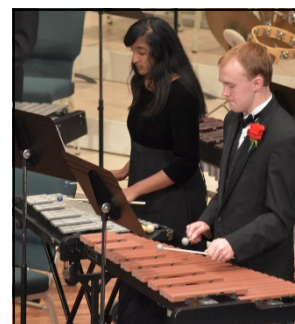


Secondary Spring Commencement Concert
